

## Warwickshire Junior Grand Prix Rules – 2017/18

These rules were amended on 25/01/2018.

### **Section A: Eligibility**

Players in one of the following categories will be eligible to appear in the standings of the Warwickshire Junior Grand Prix:-

- (a) Born in Warwickshire
- (b) Domiciled in Warwickshire
- (c) At school in Warwickshire

For the purpose of this rule, “Warwickshire” is defined as:-

- (i) The five districts of the non-metropolitan county of Warwickshire: North Warwickshire, Nuneaton & Bedworth, Rugby, Stratford-on-Avon and Warwick.
- (ii) The following three districts of the metropolitan county of West Midlands: City of Birmingham, City of Coventry, Solihull.

For the purpose of (b) and (c) above, a player who was eligible at any point between the first and last event of the season will be eligible to appear in their standings, and have all of their scores achieved in tournaments count towards their total, regardless of whether one or more of those scores was achieved when they no longer met the eligibility requirement.

A player’s age at 31<sup>st</sup> August, 2017 will determine their eligibility for each age category. For example, a player who is 9 on 31<sup>st</sup> August, 2017 will be regarded as an Under 10 for the purposes of entry into any of the tournaments below.

Category A: Under 11

### **Grand Prix 5 – Megafinal**

Category A: Under 12 – 18, Boys and Girls

*Note: The Under 7 – 11 sections, for which qualification is required, are not part of this Grand Prix.*

### **Grand Prix 6 – Rugby**

Category A: Under 11, Under 18

Category C: Under 7, Under 9, Under 11, Under 14, Under 18

**Note:** Where there are an insufficient number of entries to run an individual tournament, sections may be merged at each tournament's Chief Arbiter's discretion.

### **Section C: Rules for each Tournament**

(a) All Category A, B, C and D tournaments will be ECF-graded. Category A tournaments restricted to between Under 12 and Under 18 will be FIDE-rated.

(b) The time limit for all Grand Prix tournaments will be Game/15 + 10'.

(c) All Grand Prix tournaments will have 5 rounds; the Warwickshire Junior Championship will have 7 rounds.

(d) All Grand Prix tournaments will be open to any players; the Warwickshire Junior Championship will be restricted to players eligible as defined in Section A: Eligibility.

(e) Players may not play in an age Category other than the youngest one they are eligible to play in.

(f) Medals will be awarded at each Grand Prix event: Bronze 2½ or 3 points, Silver 3½ or 4 points, Gold 4½ or 5 points.

(g) The Warwickshire Junior Championship will also award medals: Bronze 4 or 4½ points, Silver 5 or 5½ points, Gold 6, 6½ or 7 points. The highest-scoring player(s) in each section will win the Warwickshire Junior Championship trophy for that year.

### **Category A - D**

Under 12-18 tournaments will be played in accordance with the July 2017 FIDE Laws of Chess, until 1<sup>st</sup> January, when they will be played in accordance with the January 2018 FIDE Laws of Chess.

Under 11 and younger tournaments will also be played in accordance with the FIDE Laws of Chess, except that three illegal moves will lose the game, rather than one. A player who completes an illegal move will have two minutes added to their opponents' clock.

### **Rating Restrictions for Each Category**

For tournaments restricted to Under 11 and younger:

(a) Players graded 75 or less are eligible to play in Category B tournaments.

(b) Players graded 50 or less are eligible to play in Category C tournaments.

- (c) Players graded 25 or less are eligible to play in Category D tournaments.
- (d) Ungraded players will be allocated a tournament by the organiser.

For tournaments restricted to between Under 12 and Under 18, ungraded players, or players graded 100 or less are eligible to play in Category B tournaments.

Players graded higher than either of those two limits may be permitted to play in Category B tournaments at the Organiser's discretion, if their Rapidplay grade at the time of the tournament is a category F grade.

#### **Section D: Grand Prix Scores**

A player's Grand Prix score will be the sum of the following:

- The player's score in the Warwickshire Junior Championship
- The player's three highest scores in any tournaments that season.

**Note:** Scores achieved in Category B tournaments will count as 75%, Category C tournaments will count as 50%, and Category D tournaments will count as 25%.

A player must play in at least three tournaments in order to be eligible for the Grand Prix.

In the event of a tie in the Grand Prix, the tie will be broken using the following tie-breaks until the tie is broken:-

- (a) The player who scored more points in the Warwickshire Junior Championship will be ranked higher.
- (b) The third-highest score from a Grand Prix tournament will be removed from the calculation of the player's Grand Prix score. The player with the higher remaining score will be ranked higher.
- (c) The third-highest and second-highest score from a Grand Prix tournament will be removed from the calculation of the player's Grand Prix score. The player with the higher remaining score will be ranked higher.
- (d) The player who was graded lower in the August 2017 ECF Rapidplay grading list will be ranked higher. Where one of the tied players is ungraded, this tie-break will not be used.
- (e) The player who was graded lower in the January 2018 ECF Rapidplay grading list will be ranked higher. Where one of the tied players is ungraded, this tie-break will not be used.
- (f) In the event of all of the above tie-breaks failing to split the tie, then the title will be shared.

#### **Section E: Warwickshire Junior Grand Prix Prizes**

The following will win prizes:

- (1) The highest-scoring Under 9 Boy and Under 9 Girl
- (2) The highest-scoring Under 11 Boy and Under 11 Girl
- (3) The highest-scoring Under 14 Boy and Under 14 Girl
- (4) The highest-scoring Under 18 Boy and Under 18 Girl

A player is only eligible to win a prize in the youngest of the four categories above they are eligible to win.

All Warwickshire Junior Grand Prix Champions will win the following:

- A trophy (to be kept, and is not returnable)
- Paid-for Gold membership of the English Chess Federation in 2018/19
- Free entry to a section of their choice at the 2019 Warwickshire Championship
